Left there as a prison warden and then my last three years I opened North Las Vegas jail in the middle of the pandemic as their director and once I was able to retire, I couldn't wait to move back home to Massillon. So, this was a great opportunity, I thought, to be able to come back and serve the community that I was born and raised in. So, I'm very happy to be back home and serve the community and I'm looking forward to working with all of you. Thank you.

<u>MAYOR SLUTZ</u> – Thank you. I think my next introduction probably doesn't need much of an introduction, but my Director of Development is Ted Herncane and for some of you that do not know Ted, I'll let him fill you in.

TED HERNCANE – Mr. President, Members of Council. Well, this is a change. For four years I sat there and thoroughly enjoyed myself as your colleague on Council and I wish you all a Happy New Year. I looked forward to working with you specifically in this new role as Director of Development. My background; I've got over ten years of experience in economic development, both in the public and private sector. From 2012 to 2014, I was the City's Community Development Director here. Since then, I've served five years as a President of the Massillon Westark Chamber of Commerce and Executive Director of the Massillon Development Foundation which is the economic development branch of that organization. For the last several years, I've worked in business development and economic development, both in the public and private sector. So, I'm very excited to take on this new role and I look forward to working with you all here in the coming years to really improve upon our economic development prospects here in the City.
