**ORDINANCE NO. 7 – 2021**

**BY: RULES, COURTS AND CIVIL SERVICE COMMITTEE**

AN ORDINANCE amending the OCCUPATION LIST OF CLASS TITLES – 505 PARK DEPARTMENT AND 920 GOLF COURSE DEPARTMENT, PART-TIME/TEMPORARY/SEASONAL WAGE CLASSES AND RATES, in the City of Massillon, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to pay an invoice dated January 7, 2021, and due by February 7, 2021, from the 1217 Coronavirus Relief Fund, for the year ending December 31, 2020, and declaring an emergency.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Councilman Lewis.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – Yes. Obviously, I misspoke, there were only two with the contracts. This one is the invoice that we were discussing where we had monies and services for 2020, but the invoice that we received was in 2021. So, we now are appropriating the dollars as a “Then and Now (TAN)” appropriation so that we can get this invoice paid. Are there any

questions or discussion this evening? Hearing none, I make a motion that we suspend the rules requiring three readings, bringing Ord. No. 14 – 2021 forward for a vote.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – Yes, so, Diane did express that there is an adjustment. I believe it was to MCTV bill. Is that correct, Diane?

**COUNCIL CLERK ROLLAND** – That is correct.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – So, that new total is \$110.00?

**COUNCIL CLERK ROLLAND** – No, it's zero.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – Oh, the total \$113 is coming off? Okay.

**COUNCIL CLERK ROLLAND** – Yes.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – So, she was in communication with MCTV, so that bill does not need to be paid and would not be included in any action that we take this evening. Can you state for the record, Diane, the new total?

**COUNCIL CLERK ROLLAND** – Yes. The previous total was \$1,158.08, minus the \$113, that would bring it to \$1,045.08.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – Thank you. And can you elaborate on what the Connect USA, Inc. bill for \$225 is?

**COUNCIL CLERK ROLLAND** – That you would have to take to Mr. Lombardi.

**COUNCILMAN LOMBARDI** – That was to run the cable from where the Dmark, MCTV Dmark cable comes into the building up to Council Chambers at Diane's desk.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Would that be covered by the COVID monies, or no?

**COUNCILMAN LOMBARDI** – It was supposed to have been, but I'm not sure. The work was done well in time, but I'm not sure why they took so long to invoice us. So, I don't know about that since the invoice came in so late.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Does someone have an answer to that? Because it appears that we're paying that bill.

**COUNCILMAN LEWIS** – It would have to be the Auditor's office; we'd have to call upon Ms. Bonk to see if she could elaborate.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Ms. Bonk.

**DEBBIE BONK** – Good evening, Council. There is no COVID money left to pay that invoice. All the COVID Relief money was accounted for in 2020 and we had to have everything encumbered and paid. Now, if we get some in, of course we can use it for that.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Thank you.

**DEBBIE BONK** – Your welcome.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Also, the \$113, Diane had noticed that we were still paying that and we're really not using the Ethernet service. Councilman Lombardi, can you elaborate on that?

**COUNCILMAN LOMBARDI** – Yes. When I first started this project, we had to get onto our own internet service. Since then, the City has changed things around and decided to put Council on their internet service. So, we don't need the MCTV. The City is using Massillon Cable as well, so it kind of was like a double hit. So, we don't need Massillon Cable, our own separate Massillon Cable connection. We're on now with the City's connection.

**COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK** – Thank you. Nice catch on that, Diane.

**COUNCIL CLERK ROLLAND** – Your welcome.

L.J. DELUCA – Yes, Madam President.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT ISTNICK – Go ahead.

L.J. DELUCA – 2954 Veterans Blvd. S.E., Massillon, Ohio. I want to talk a little bit about the City of Green as opposed to the City of Massillon, Ohio. The City of Green, despite their 2020 challenges like Massillon and the COVID-19, the Mayor Gerrard Newbauer, the city is stronger in 2021. The questions that I have is in 2020 the income tax revenue which usually makes up 65% of the budget, was only \$23.4 million or 5.3% down from 2019. The Mayor said that the city received \$30.5 million dollars in other revenue services. So, I think that's wonderful and I just had a look here for comparison here. The City of Massillon, \$32,866, give me a couple of people. Green, \$26,000, they have robust safety forces over all this, well-maintained roadways and very good catch basins. The City of Massillon spans over 19 miles; we have a poverty rate of 17.27%, 1,733 people per square mile and our average income is only \$57,366, we're still working on catch basins. They got a relatively new company there, FedEx Freight, not the FedEx that I go up to. This FedEx Freight about 219 on Global Parkway. But, I was just wondering where that money comes from? I have a lot of questions and I want to work on that and I want to investigate that. And finally, I want to end up, Madam President, we need to ban together. We got to be powerful. Massillon strong, Ohio strong. Your Massillon neighborhoods strong. I know we have something coming up here for the Street Dept.; a continuation of an existing 0.2% levy of income tax, but I've asked some people around town and they said that they just don't see this in action and I want to be fair to the Mayor and to Mr. Lee McBride, I'll do some more investigation on that too and get back with everybody. Thank you very much and have a great night.
