17th Street NE Bridge —Funding for this project has been approved from ODOT's Ohio Bridge Partnership. This is a design/build project that will be administered by ODOT. Construction on hold. Relocation of utility poles conflict.

SANITARY SEWERS

<u>State Avenue Sewer Rehab</u> – Began survey and preliminary design work on replacing a portion of the sanitary sewer. The design of Phase 1 and Phase 2 is 90% completed. Will be seeking funding sources to construct this project.

Noble Place NW Sewer Rehab - Survey needed, design update needed.

Oakwood Ave NE Sewer Rehab - Survey completed, emergency repair completed.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

<u>WWTP Upgrade Project</u> – Current project scope is to upgrade the existing WWTP average daily flow from 15.8 MGD to 17.0 MGD; modify existing aeration tanks, primary and secondary clarifiers, and sludge pumping to enable biological nutrient removal; replace and upgrade tertiary filter capacity; modify sludge conditioning and digestion facilities; modify and upgrade electrical and instrumentation systems. <u>2015 Priority Street Segment Resurfacing Project</u> – Paving and catch basins completed on 17th Street, Tommy Henrich, Federal Avenue and 1st Street N.W., 8th St. N.E., 11th St. N.E., and Amherst Road and portion of Lake Avenue. Began Tommy Henrich extension.

<u>2017 Street Resurfacing Project</u> – Bid opening March 22, 2017. Karvo Paving low bidder, contract #1. Specialized Construction low bidder contract #2 & #3. Karvo expected to begin 5/22, Specialized to begin late June.

<u>Tommy Henrich Drive</u> – Survey completed – preliminary design. Dedication plat approved by Planning Commission on February 8, 2017. Design completed. Construction of new roadway began week of 5/8/17.

Lake Ave NE Resurfacing - From 1st Street NE to Amherst Road NE. Apply for grant in July 2017.

I also met with the Mayor and representatives from Comquest to discuss heroin and related addiction and rehabilitation issues particularly at their facility. There was also a final Diversity Committee meeting before the Diversity breakfast.

On the 27th of the month, I attended the final meeting of the fiscal emergency team. At that time, the Auditor of State presented the City with a declaration signifying the end of fiscal emergency status.

On the 28th of the month, I attended the Diversity breakfast at which time Fire/Medic Brian Weber was presented with the Firefighter of the Year award from the Mayor. I applaud Brian for his efforts and his accomplishment.

On the 21st of the month, I attended a meeting for the Car Show. I also attended a meeting of the LEPC Executive Board regarding budget. Finally, I attended the quarterly Stark County Fire Chief's Association meeting at Arrowhead Country Club.

Inspector Canfora and Captain Ganoe attended the Fire Investigation class put on by the State Fire Marshal as part of an ongoing effort to continue the transition within the Fire Prevention Bureau and the ability to train our personnel to investigate fires within the City.

At the quarterly LEPC meeting, Doug Wood formally replaced Don McDonald as the LEPC Program Coordinator. Don was a fantastic resource for our facilities who utilize "Extremely

Hazardous Substances" in order to conduct their business and he was an invaluable resource to first responders who must deal with emergencies at those facilities. We wish him well in his retirement and we welcome Doug to the committee.

As the department migrates to the county 800 MHz radio system, there was an issue presented to Motorola Inc. regarding the batteries for the single band portable radios. Apparently, a certain type of battery designed for use with the intrinsically safe portable will not effectively operate in extremely cold temperatures. As Motorola is working on the solution, they have provide the department (along with Jackson Township, Lawrence Township & Wilmot as part of the grant recipient group) with alternative batteries until a solution can be provided. That solution, which is expected to be sometime during the spring of 2018, will result in Motorola replacing the temporary battery fix with a permanent battery designed for the single band portable at that time.

As the department finishes the first third of 2017, the call volume is such that it stands again to be the busiest year on record in the history of the Massillon Fire Department.

TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In April of 2017 the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 199 traffic citations, 52 less traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 19 arrests for OVI, 2 less than were made in April of 2016. Radar Citations for the month totaled 26; this was 54 less than during the same time period last year.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 86 traffic accidents during April. This was 3 less accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 56 property damage accidents, 12 injury accidents, no fatal accidents, and 18 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents there were 16 hit skip accidents, and there were 6 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There were no pedestrian or bicycle accidents during the month. There were 2 motorcycle accidents. The Massillon Police Department investigated 8 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 2 reported injuries.

In April of 2017 there were 78 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 7 more than were towed in April of 2016. Of the above tows, 36 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 20 as a direct result of an arrest, 13 for parking violations and 6 for traffic offenses of some type. There were 3 misc. tows and 1 recovered stolen vehicle.

During the month of April 2017 the traffic officer mailed 22 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 17 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During April 2017, the traffic officer was able to junk or title 13 motor vehicles. Also during the month of April the traffic officer issued or acted upon 34 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 18 parking citations and investigated 17 school bus violations.

As of the last day of April 2017 there were 40 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of the two city tow companies, Reed's and Patriot. Of the 40 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
