Date: September 4, 2018,

- **Housing:** Currently working on one Full Rehabilitation project. Completed one emergency repair project in which a hot water heater was installed in a low income, elderly household.
- **Fair Housing:** For the month of August I received 18 Fair Housing inquiries in addition to those that Bev received. The majority of these calls were tenant concerns and complaints. Several of the calls taken were referred to Code Enforcement for review. On August 11th the Housing Department once again had a booth at the Fun Fest to educate citizens on Fair Housing issues and provide information on the different programs available in the City of Massillon.
- **NIP:** 9 reimbursement packets were approved, and a total of \$96,386.54 will be reimbursed to the City for the most recent round of demolitions. Asbestos abatement was completed on 17 properties and demolition activities were started. Additional information for 15 properties was submitted to Stark Regional Planning Commission, bringing the total number of properties being pursued for demolition to 75.
- **Meetings:** For the month of August I participated in the following meetings:

 - August 28th-Pre-construction meeting with homeowner and contractor for full rehabilitation project

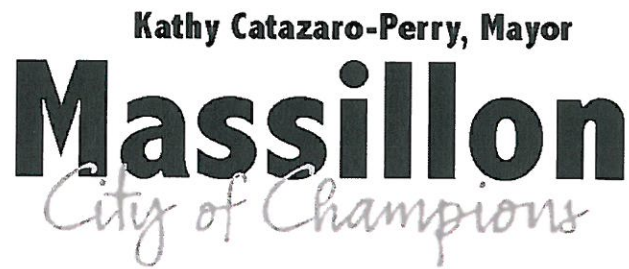

On the 2nd of the month, I attended the monthly LOGIC Board meeting.

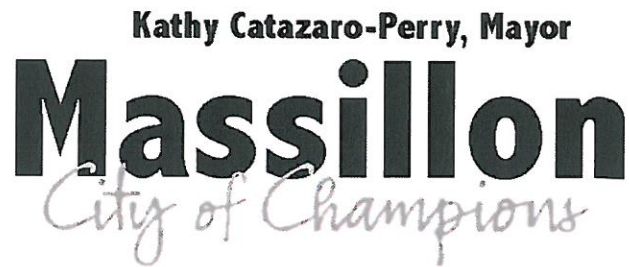
On the 9th of the month, I attended the 911 Countywide Dispatch Governance meeting.



The total income tax receipts posted for August 2018 was \$1,305,261.55. This amount is an increase from August 2017 of \$30,048.31 (+2%).

Year to date income tax receipts posted through the eight months of 2018 was \$14,419,696.26. Receipts posted year to date through the eight months was an increase from 2017 of \$+153,876.59 (+1%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 74% of all tax collections through the year of 2018. Individual income tax payments represent 17% of all tax collections through the year of 2018 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 9%.

Average monthly income for the eight months of 2018 is \$1,802,462.03. Average monthly income for the year of 2017 was \$1,734,942.16.

Year to date refunds for 2018 was \$438,295.74 compared to refunds for 2017 of \$341,944.32. Refunds difference \$96,351.42 (more in refunds 2018 compared to 2017).

Target budget from Auditor's Revenue Report is 66.67% for the following accounts for 2018. Account percentages collected for the eight months of 2018 are as follows:

In August of 2018, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 241 traffic citations, 71 more traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 20 arrests for OVI, 7 more than were made in August of 2017. Radar Citations for the month totaled 36; this was 22 more than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 87 traffic accidents during August. That was 3 less accidents than the same time period last year. There were 55 property damage accidents, 12 injury accidents and 20 private property accidents during the month. There were 2 motorcycle accidents and no fatalities. Of the above accidents, there were 16 hit skip accidents and there were 6 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There was 1 bicycle accident during the month and no pedestrian accidents. The Massillon Police Department investigated 9 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 3 reported injuries.

In August of 2018 there were 83 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 11 more than were towed in August of 2017. Of the above tows, 32 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 15 for traffic offenses of some type, 16 as a direct result of an arrest, 17 for parking violations. There were no misc. tows and 3 recovered stolen vehicles.

During the month of August 2018 the traffic officer mailed 16 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 11 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During August 2018, the traffic officer was able to junk or title 29 motor vehicles. Also during the month of August, the traffic officer issued or acted upon 48 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 17 parking citations.

As of the last day of August 2018 there were 64 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Reed's and Patriot Towing Services. Of the 64 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
