Attached is the monthly report for the Massillon Fire Department for August, 2021.

The department responded to a total of 543 alarms during the month. This averages to 17.5 alarms per day. There were 150 fire alarm and public service calls and 393 rescue and EMS calls. There were no fire-related injuries or deaths.

On the 5th of the month, I attended the monthly LOGIC Board meeting.

On the 9th of the month, I went to the Ohio Fire Academy to start the Fire Safety Inspector Hybrid Class. This certification will provide additional credentials to support the Fire Prevention Bureau staff with inspections, issuing citations, and appeals. The class ends in mid-October.

On the 10th of the month, I attended the county Incident Management Assist Team (IMAT) meeting at Canton Township Fire Administration Offices.

On the 17th of the month, I attended the Massillon City Schools Convocation at the High School.

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On the 17th of the month, I met with Lori Boron to discuss the 2022 Fire Department Budget.

On the 18th of the month, the Fire Department along with City Administration and other City departments partnered with the Devin Moore Foundation to provide CPR/AED awareness training to members of the community. The parties involved believed the initial event was successful and look forward to working together in the future.

On the 23rd of the month, I attended the staff meeting via zoom. I also attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Stark County Sheriff's Training facility at 1st and Tremont SE. I also attended a meeting with the Mayor, Safety Service Director, and Tim Boerner from the Massillon Football Booster Club to discuss fireworks at home football games.

On the 26th of the month, I assisted the Civil Service Director in administering the firefighter/medic entrance exam. There were 24 applicants for the position. Eighteen were eligible to take the exam, however, only 14 applicants took the exam. There were 12 applicants who passed the exam and are eligible to move on in the process if all other criteria are met. Currently, only six candidates meet all requirements for employment. We will schedule interviews for late September or early October.

We continue to progress through the transition as new officers settle in to their roles. All officers now have responsibility and oversight for at least one operational program or logistical need. There is a learning curve for all involved as members become accustomed to their additional responsibility and authority. The learning curve is starting to flatten and the benefits of the new process are starting to show including a better understanding of department operations, fiscal areas, purchasing procedures, and how all those components work together to make the department operationally effective and fiscally responsible.

Physicals were delayed earlier in the year due to management staff changes at Wellnow Urgent Care. Those changes are now finalized and most fire department members have completed



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their required yearly physical. We included the healthcare wellness form in the process and should start to show up on Medical Mutual Health Insurance program which will assist in meeting goals related to health care cost savings.

Firefighter Markwood and I attended several meetings in August regarding the implementation of the Box Alarm Runcard Builder (BARB) software at RED Center. This software provides a quicker, more efficient means for developing run cards imported into RED Center's Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system. The software uses data from the county GIS and the CAD's historical data to determine the order in which emergency units should be dispatched based on type of incident, estimated response time, type of emergency vehicle requested, and any specific rules applied based on road closures or major events. When the system build is complete and entered into the CAD, incident commanders and dispatchers will see a reduction in workload and greater efficiency dispatching the appropriate apparatus and personnel.

- The Housing Department had a booth at the annual Family Fun Fest. We distributed information on Fair Housing and Tenant & Landlord Rights, as well as information and brochures about the housing programs that the City offers. Participation in the Fun Fest requires a free or nearly-free activity for children, so this year the Department handed out bird house kits for children to build and decorate their own bird house. “Every one deserves a home” was our theme.
- Completed and submitted the second substantial amendment for the 2020 Annual Action Plan to include the third and final round of CDBG-CV funding and modified activities. HUD now has up to 45 days to approve the written plan.
- Continued working with Code Enforcement on the City’s 2021 Demolition Program. Awarded bids and contracts. Asbestos abatement activities were completed on most of the properties this month and demolition activity should begin in September.
- Continued accounting and financial management for CDBG expenditures. Reported and made entries in IDIS for accounting management. Completed and updated accomplishments of CDBG activities in IDIS. Continued monitoring of CDBG sub recipients and their programs.

- **Fair Housing Calls for the Month: Beverly 17 Anna 20**

Code Enforcement Involvement – Yes, as needed

Were any of them discrimination related? Yes, papers were filled out and submitted to the Ohio Civil Rights Commission by the filer of the complaint.

- **Housing Rehabilitation Projects:** One of the Full Rehabilitations has been awarded to a contractor and we are waiting on the completion of the color chart so that we can have the Pre-Construction meeting.
- **The second Rehabilitation-** We are waiting for Mr. Williams to provide the specifications to determine if we will be able to move forward. This depends on the amount of work that will be needed to rehab this home.
- **Minor Repair:** We have bids out again for a ramp and lift. We have a Contractor who said he would be able to provide a bid for this one soon.
- We also have another requesting plumbing and electric. Bids have been received and awarded. We have had the pre-construction meeting and work is scheduled to begin .
- We have received the request for a home owners windows and electric work to be done. We have a Contractor and have had the pre-construction meeting. Work is scheduled to begin in September, there may be a delay in getting the windows due to the shortage.
- Application sent out to a lady who is requesting help with her front and back porch. We have a Contractor who will be able to do the front porch, we have had the pre-construction meeting and work is scheduled to begin in September.
- We have received a bid for a homeowner in need of electrical work. This was completed in August.
- **Emergency Rehabilitation Projects:** We have bids out for another roof, we have a Contractor and work will begin in Sept.
- We also have another couple who has yet to complete verification.
- We have finally contacted the homeowner in need of a furnace. She has been ill, and lost the papers we originally sent; we have re-sent the forms to her. We have been in communication and she provided the application, I shared with her that we need the support letter for 2021 from Social Security. She is getting that sent to her.
- We have another homeowner in need of a furnace, we will be signing paper in Sept to get her furnace installed.
- **First time Homebuyer Assisted:**
- We have provided another first-time homebuyer with down payment assistance, we will be sending her the Intent to Proceed with her RRS items.
- We have also closed on two more first time homebuyers and sent them the Intent to Proceed so that we can do their RRS items.
- We have a home buyer ready to close in September.
- There are three other homebuyers, still early in the process and in varying positions.
- There was one homebuyer who was over-income, we could not provide him assistance.

We did have a caller share her complaint and ask for where she could file a complaint of discrimination. She has filed a complaint with the Ohio Civil Rights Commission located in Akron. (concerning unfair treatment from EANDC.)

- **Housing:** Working with two home owners for Full Rehabs: We have awarded to contractors, and should be able to start work on these in September. Homebuyers: We had another new home owner purchase a home this month with help of our down payment assistance program. Minimum code items are being repaired in homes of all our new home owners . We have another home owner scheduled to close next week, another approved, and applications for two more! This program continues to bring new residents to our city !
- **Fair Housing:** For the month of August I received 20 fair housing calls. Calls included both landlord, tenant and repair issues. We have continued to educate ourselves on protection and assets available to tenants facing foreclosure. Code has assisted in failure to repair calls. Fair housing was able to assist in a formal complaint being filed this month for a tenant experiencing discrimination. We attended Fun Fest in August. We were able to get a lot of information out to Massillon residents, and have received several calls from attendees. Turnout was great for this event.
- **Community Development:** Sub recipient funding agreements were sent out, and we are receiving these back. We are looking forward to utilizing funding for the new program year, as we have a lot of projects under way . We were able to complete another roof and repair a leaky roof for Massillon homeowners. Two more roofs are scheduled for replacement right in time for the colder months. We have a project under way for emergency furnace replacement, and another for window replacement for a homeowner that hasn't had functioning windows in many years. We are also excited to start the porch repair for a homeowner that has a very unsafe porch.
- **Administrative:** Prepared and paid bills/ IDIS drawdowns for funds. Updated activities as necessary. Ledger balanced and maintained accurately throughout the month. Updated housing project ledger, and financial ledger. Prepared sub recipient funding agreements. Updated pamphlets and brochures for department. Other tasks upon assignment. Supplies ordered as needed.

Curb installed June 12th. Asphalt installed June 24th. Working on a few punch list items. Plat recorded on September 6th. Roadway is open and in use. Street lights installed.

Westbrook Estates Phase V- Plans submitted and approved by City Engineer, and Ohio EPA. Underground utility work has begun and is 100% complete. Final plat for Phase 5A approved by Planning Commission on April 10, 2019. Phase 5B and 5C approved by Planning Commission on June 12th. Curb and roadway have been installed. Housing construction complete. Street lighting installed.

Subject: Income Tax Monthly Report – August 2021

Date: September 7, 2021

The total income tax receipts posted for August 2021 was \$1,727,244.02. This amount is an increase from August 2020 of \$179,922.60. (+12%)

Year to date income tax receipts posted through 2021 was \$15,712,156.52. Receipts posted for 2021 was an increase from 2020 of \$1,762,739.13. (+13%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represent 70% of all tax collections through the year of 2021. Individual income tax payments represent 14% of all tax collections through the year of 2021 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 16%.

Average monthly income for the eight months of 2021 is \$1,964,019.57. Average monthly income for the year of 2020 was \$1,674,131.35. Average monthly income for the year of 2019 was \$1,758,409.86.

Year to date refunds for 2021 was \$403,289.79 compared to refunds for 2020 of \$279,655.00. Refunds difference \$123,634.79 (more refunds in 2021 compared to 2020).

Target budget from Auditor's Revenue Report is 66.67% for the following accounts for 2021. Account percentages collected for the eight months of 2021 are as follows:

In August of 2021, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 130 traffic citations, 15 more traffic citations that was issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 9 arrests for OVI, 5 more than was made in August of 2020. Radar Citations for the month totaled 20; this was 6 less than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 77 traffic accidents during August 2020. This was 14 more accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 43 property damage accidents, 17 injury accidents, and 23 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents, there were 11 hit skip accidents, and there was 0 accident that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There were no pedestrian, bicycle, or motorcycle accidents. There were 3 commercial accidents during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 8 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 0 reported injuries. There were 0 fatal accidents.

In August of 2021 there were 84 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 17 more than were towed in August of 2020. Of the above tows, 26 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 11 for traffic offenses of some type, 25 as a direct result of an arrest, and 19 for parking violations. There were 0 vehicles towed as stolen/recovered and 3 misc. tow.

During the month of August 2021 the traffic officer mailed 30 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 23 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During August 2021, the traffic officer was able to junk or title 21 motor vehicles. Also during the month of August, the traffic officer issued or took action on 35 warning notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court orders for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 20 parking citations and conducted 0 garbage truck inspections and investigated 1 school bus violation

As of the last day of August 2021 there were 57 motor vehicles sitting at the impound lots of Reed's and Patriot Towing Services. Of the 57 vehicles, several are waiting for court orders to dispose of them as well as 3 being in secured storage.
