New Business (continued)

- 2. Approval to hire a Sanitarian
 - a. The Massillon City Health Department has need of a Sanitarian-in-training or a Registered Sanitarian to take on Environmental work full time. Our new Food Establishments have increased by 62 in the last 5 years add in Accreditation, and the workload is too much for 1 Sanitarian. On a motion by Jim Johnson, and seconded by Dr. Sonia Ullum, approval was granted to hire if Council passes our budget in January 2020. Motion carried.
- 3. Presentation of a Narcan / Naloxone program
 - a. Audrey Sylvester will present a new harm reduction program that we are considering for the Health Department. On a motion by Dr. Sonia Ulium, and seconded by Jeff Thornberry, approval was granted to table this item until the next board meeting. Motion carried.
- 4. Update of Vaping
 - a. Numbers of deaths from vaping are increasing, and Mayo Clinic doctors are concerned with toxicity in the chemical fumes. Ohio HB 346 has been introduced to prohibit flavored electronic smoking devices. The Health Department supports study of the risks associated with Vaping.
- 5. Update on Gun Violence

a. AOHC is considering a report in the CDC morbidity and mortality report on gun violence – they want to see stronger language in establishing conformity than "should", in respecting freedoms allowed under the 2nd Amendment.
