At the first of the year, the department changed its radio nomenclature from specifically assigned unit designations to plain language description. As an example, as the Fire Chief I am no longer Chief 200 but now am Massillon Chief 1. The downtown rescue is no longer Rescue 218 but now Massillon Medic 1. Based on NIMS and the ICS Federal structure, these changes were made so it is apparent what type of unit is responding.

Migration to the MARC's radio platform continues and as of January 31st, most fire agencies were on the new system. There are procedural and operational changes that now allow for mutual aid companies to speak seamlessly to each other.

Station # 3 is coming along very well. I have not listed all the construction meetings; however, there have been several. The roof work is complete as well as most of the interior framing. Currently, painting, drywall and furnishings are being undertaken. The floor in the apparatus bay will be the final step on the interior and the parking lot is expected to be paved in mid-March.

The total income tax receipts posted for January 2019 was \$1,763,798.79. This amount is a decrease from January 2018 of \$-94,826.48 (-5%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 83% of all tax collections for January 2019. Individual income tax payments represent 12% of all tax collections for January 2019 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 05%.

Average monthly income for the year of 2018 was \$1,740,903.69. Average monthly income for the year of 2017 was \$1,734,942.16.

Year to date refunds for 2019 was -0- compared to year to date refunds for 2018 of \$17,549.22.

TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In January 2019 the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 190 traffic citations, 11 more traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 11 arrests for OVI, 4 less than in January of 2018. Radar citations for the month totaled 27; this was 5 more than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 85 traffic accidents during January. This was 17 less accidents than occurred during the same time period last year. There were 51 property damage accidents, 10 injury accidents, 24 accidents that occurred on private property, and no fatal accidents. Of the above accidents there were 15 hit skip accidents, there were 4 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There were no pedestrian or motorcycle accidents. There was 1 bicycle accident during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 11 accidents involving juveniles that resulted in 2 injuries.

In January 2019 there were 79 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 2 more than were towed in January of 2018. Of the above tows, 37 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 8 for traffic offenses of some type, 16 as a direct result of an arrest and 15 for parking violations. There was 1 miscellaneous tow and 2 recovered/stolen vehicles in January 2019.

During the month of January 2019 the traffic officer mailed 55 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 40 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During January 2019, the traffic officer was able to junk or title 33 motor vehicles. Also during the month of January the traffic officer issued or acted upon 27 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices) and issued 14 Parking Summons. The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. 2 school bus violations were investigated.

As of the last day of January 2019 there were 69 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Reed's Incorporated and Patriot Towing Service. Of the 69 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
