- Housing: Currently working on two homebuyer assistance applications and one full rehabilitation project.
- <u>Fair Housing:</u> For the month of June I received 22 Fair Housing inquiries in addition to those that Bev received. The majority of these calls were tenant concerns and complaints. Several of the calls taken were referred to Code Enforcement for review. Two of the calls were referred to contact a lawyer for legal advice due to pending evictions.
- NIP: Received reimbursement approval for 10 properties, a total of \$107,427.05 will be received. Currently in the process of preparing 9 additional reimbursement packets.
 Bidding opened for asbestos abatement and property demolition on an additional 17 properties.

ACTIVITY REPORT:

Code Enforcement Involvement? Yes Code and Fair Housing worked together and we were able to speak to the tenants, who had reasonable concerns for the repairs that needed to be done. After speaking with the Property owner we found out that the tenants is seriously behind in rent. They are being evicted, but the property cannot be rented until Code is satisfied with the needed repairs, as stipulated in the report given to the property manager and owner.

- Housing Rehabilitation Projects: We have two Full Rehabilitations under way, one is nearing completion. We are moving forward in getting another Full Rehabilitation underway.
- <u>Minor Repair</u> We have two Rehabilitations that were too extensive and well over the allotted amount. Once we receive funds we will be able to assist them in the necessity items, such as electric, plumbing, etc.
- Emergency Rehabilitation Projects: In our Emergency Department we have completed the electric request for one homeowner, and a roof for another one. We have several roof requests which will probably have to be considered in the Fall of the year; once we receive additional funding.
- FIRST TIME HOMEBUYERS ASSISTED: We have just completed the down payment assistance for one First Time Homebuyer. We will be moving forward with the RRS items, which are the minimum code items identified by the Regional Inspector, but do not exceed \$5,000.00 to repair.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

<u>WWTP Upgrade Project</u> – Current project scope is to upgrade the existing WWTP average daily flow from 15.8 MGD to 17.0 MGD; modify existing aeration tanks, primary and secondary clarifiers, and sludge pumping to enable biological nutrient removal; replace and upgrade tertiary filter capacity; modify sludge conditioning and digestion facilities; modify and upgrade electrical and instrumentation systems. 2018 Street Resurfacing Project – Began estimating and evaluating streets for 2018. Street list was compiled, and project bids opened on March 28, 2018. Northstar Asphalt is lowest bidder. Work has begun on Thomas Circle, Colonial Parkway, State NE, 9th NE, 23rd NE, Kaylynn, Virginia SE. Work continuing 5th St SW, Tremont SE.

The department responded to a total of 461 alarms during the month. This averages to 15.4 alarms per day. There were 93 fire alarms and public service calls, and 368 rescue and EMS calls. There were 0 firefighter or civilian injuries due to fires.

On the 4th of the month, I attended a dispatch consolidation meeting.

On the $4^{th}-6^{th}$ of the month, the department held monthly Continuing Education for EMS with run review.

On the 7th of the month, I attended the monthly LOGIC Board meeting.

On the 12th of the month, I attended a meeting at Aultman Hospital concerning a cancer study for firefighters conducted in partnership with Aultman Hospital and the Ohio State University.

On the 13th of the month, I attended a webinar for Kronos telestaffing scheduler option for firefighters.

On the 16th of the month, the annual Cruise-On-In-and-Dance show was held. The department covered the needs of the city well and responded to several EMS incidents at the show itself. I believe the safety plan we have in place is a good one.

On the 19th of the month, I attended the LEPC Planning and Exercise Committee meeting regarding HIRA and site visits for EHS facilities.

Date: July 12, 2018

The total income tax receipts posted for June 2018 was \$2,206,174.29. This amount is an increase from June 2017 of \$+338,876.78 (+18%).

Year to date income tax receipts posted through the second quarter of 2018 was \$11,595,025.24. Receipts posted year to date through the second quarter was an increase from 2017 of \$+143,165.11 (+1%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 70% of all tax collections through the year of 2018. Individual income tax payments represent 19% of all tax collections through the year of 2018 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 11%.

Average monthly income for the six months of 2018 is \$1,932,504.20. Average monthly income for the year of 2017 was \$1,734,942.16.

Year to date refunds for 2018 was \$389,241.65 compared to refunds for 2017of \$325,844.10. Refunds difference \$63,397.55 (more in refunds 2018 compared to 2017).

Target budget from Auditor's Revenue Report is 50% for the following accounts for 2018. Account percentages collected for the six months of 2018 are as follows:

TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In June of 2018, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 189 traffic citations, 8 less traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 9 arrests for OVI, 15 less than were made in June of 2017. Radar Citations for the month totaled 31; this was 2 less than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 81 traffic accidents during June. This was 5 less accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 49 property damage accidents, 7 injury accidents, there were 25 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents there were 9 hit skip accidents. There were no accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There were no pedestrian accidents and 1 bicycle accident during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 7 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 2 injuries. There was 1 motorcycle accident and no fatal accidents.

In June of 2018 there were 68 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 16 less than were towed in June of 2017. Of the above tows, 28 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 12 for traffic offenses, 13 as a direct result of an arrest, 13 for parking violations, There were 2 recovered stolen vehicles and no miscellaneous tows.

During the month of June 2018, the traffic officer mailed 39 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 29 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During June 2017, the traffic officer was able to junk or title 26 motor vehicles. Also during the month of June, the traffic officer issued or acted upon 33 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 15 parking citations. The traffic officer mailed no warning letters for stopped school bus violations.

As of the last day of June 2018 there were 61 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Patriot and Reed's Towing Services. Of the 61 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
