- Continued planning, preparing, and implementing modified Community Development and Housing operations in response to the current Coronavirus/COVID-19 situation
- Began demolition process for two large commercial structures that have been deemed unsafe by the City's building department. Removal of these blighted properties will have a significant impact in the neighborhood. Asbestos surveys were completed, and the bidding process began.
- Continued preparing and planning for additional CDBG funding awarded to the City of Massillon through the CARES Act/ U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The majority of this funding will be dedicated to a business assistance program for small businesses with 25 or fewer employees. Completed preparation of applications, agreements, and information brochures for this program. A Public Hearing was held via teleconference on June 8th, 2020. City Council approved the CDBG-CV budget on June 15, 2020.
- Continued accounting and financial management for CDBG expenditures. Reported and made entries in IDIS for accounting management. Completed and updated accomplishments of CDBG activities in IDIS. Continued monitoring of CDBG sub recipients and their programs.
- Continued to monitor calls, responsibilities, and procedures of the CDBG Code Enforcement
 Contractor for the City. Reviewed and monitored all record keeping being sure requirements are

- <u>Minor Repair</u> We are waiting on the specifications from the Regional Inspector for one elderly homeowner who needs a bathroom modification.
- <u>Emergency Rehabilitation Projects:</u> We have bid out for one homeowner in need of a sump pump replacement.
- We are in the process of assisting a disabled couple with repair in central air. They both
 have medical problems that require them to have air. We contracted with Reliable for
 this emergency assistance.
- FIRST TIME HOMEBUYERS ASSISTED: Questions: No questions. We have one First Time Homebuyer. Sellers provided some of the repairs needed on the home. We are waiting for the Regional Inspectors report in regards what the buyer's responsibility will be once he is the owner. The former specification showed that he would be responsible for over \$8,000 for his RRS items. FHA determined that the loan could not be secured by the financial institution until some of those items were repaired.

Attached is the monthly report for the Massillon Fire Department for June, 2020.

The department responded to a total of 511 alarms during the month. This averages to 17.0 alarms per day. There were 94 fire alarms and public service calls, and 417 rescue and EMS calls. There were 0 firefighter or civilian injuries due to fires.

On the 4^{th} of the month, I attended the monthly LOGIC Board meeting.

On the 5th of the month, Capt. Don Smith retired after 30 years of service to the city. Most recently, he was the City Superintendent of Buildings/Fire Marshal. He will be sorely missed.

On the 8th of the month, Katelyn Lindsay, Matthew Seward and Bryan McMaster were sworn in as our newest Probationary Firefighters.

On the 24th of the month, the Stark County LEPC had its quarterly meeting by Zoom Conference.

The annual Cruise-On-In-and-Dance show was cancelled due to Covid-19 concerns.

The City continues to operate under the ICS system for Covid-19 and our operational periods continue to be bi-weekly instead of weekly. Because the Governor has begun opening up businesses and industry, there is some apprehension that Ohio will see a spike in new cases over the course of the next few weeks. There is some discussion about reducing the number of meetings through consolidation; however, there will not be an increase in the length of the

Subject: Income Tax Monthly Report – June 2020

Date: July 6, 2020

The total income tax receipts posted for June 2020 was \$2,273,716.01. This amount is an increase from June 2019 of \$309,143.36 (16%).

Year to date income tax receipts posted through the first six months 2020 was \$10,238,091.25. Receipts posted for 2020 was a decrease from 2019 of \$-1,190,185.71 (-10%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 73% of all tax collections through the year of 2020. Individual income tax payments represent 16% of all tax collections through the year of 2020 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 11%.

Average monthly income for the first six months of 2020 is \$1,721,348.54. Average monthly income for the year of 2019 was \$1,758,409.86. Average monthly income for the year of 2018 was \$1,740,903.69.

Year to date refunds for 2020 is \$223,451.92 compared to refunds for 2019 of \$176,085.08. Refunds difference \$47,366.84 (more in refunds 2020 compared to 2019).

Target budget from Auditor's Revenue Report is 50.00% for the following accounts for 2020. Account percentages collected for the first six months of 2020 are as follows:

TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In June of 2020, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 104 traffic citations, 63 less than was issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 6 arrests for OVI, 4 less than were made in June of 2019. Radar citations for the month totaled 18; this was 2 less than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 70 traffic accidents during June. This was 1 more accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 32 property damage accidents, 16 injury accidents, there were 22 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents there were 7 hit skip accidents, and there were 3 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. The Massillon Police Department investigated 4 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 0 reported injuries. There was 1 motorcycle, 0 bicycle and no pedestrian accidents during the month. There were 1 fatal accident in the city in the month of June.

In June of 2020 there were 73 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 1 more than the number towed in June of 2019. Of the above tows, 29 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 4 for traffic offenses of some type, 11 as a direct result of an arrest, 25 for parking violations. There was 1 recovered stolen vehicle and 1 misc. tows.

During the month of June 2020, the traffic officer mailed 25 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 18 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During June 2020 the traffic officer was able to junk or title 20 motor vehicles. Also during the month of June the traffic officer issued or acted upon 39 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 27 parking citations and investigated 0 school bus violation.

As of the last day of June 2020 there were 54 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of the two towing companies, Reed's and Patriot, with 3 in secured storage. Of the 54 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
