1. **Housing:** Full Rehab: We have a homeowner approved for program, we are waiting on work specifications from Reliable and RPC. Our homebuyers' program is very busy, with 7 approved home owners, we have 4 now under contract for purchase. We are busy preparing paperwork and files, scheduling credit counseling, and arranging inspections. At least 4 new home owners in Massillon City should close on their new homes in next month.
- **Fair Housing:** For the month of May I received 26 fair housing calls. Calls included both landlord, tenant and repair issues. We have started getting calls with vacate or eviction questions. Renters have reached out concerning rent increases as well. We have seen that many landlords are giving 30-day notices on month to month renters in order to sell properties due to booming housing market at this time.
- **Community Development:** One emergency, and one minor repair are awaiting bids. We hope to roof another home, and along with a furnace, will be updating a home's unsafe electric. We have applications for two other roofs, awaiting paperwork, as well as a minor repair where the home owner is in bad need of new windows. All checks were cut and mailed to HMRP approved applicants this month as well. We have begun preparing for the 2020 FY. Many three-month verifications were sent to small business loan recipients this month as well.
- **Administrative:** Prepared and paid bills/ IDIS drawdowns for funds. Updated activities as necessary. Ledger balanced and maintained accurately throughout the month. Housing project ledger is up to date. Other tasks upon assignment. Supplies ordered as needed.

- Completed a Financial Education Webinar series for interested Massillon citizens. This four-part educational series was held throughout May, and the series was hosted by Apprisen via Zoom. Courses were provided at no cost to attendees. The series covered the following topics:
  - May 5 – Making the Most of your Income
  - May 12 – Understanding Credit Reports and Scores
  - May 19 – Handling Credit and Debt wisely
  - May 26 – Preparing for homeownership
- Finished preparing the 2021 Annual Action Plan, which is due to HUD by May 15, 2021. This plan outlines the budget for PY2021 and project details of activities we will be undertaking. City Council approved this plan on May 3, 2021. The City then received notice this month that HUD's Office of Community Planning and Development has discovered an error in the formula calculations for the CDBG program. The correction of this error has resulted in the City of Massillon receiving an increase of 1.47%, which equals \$9,704. Although this revision does not trigger a substantial amendment, we did publish a public notice to notify interested parties of the revised budget and provided an expedited 3-day comment period on the revisions.
- Continued working with Code Enforcement on the City's 2021 Demolition Program.
- Continued accounting and financial management for CDBG expenditures. Reported and made entries in IDIS for accounting management. Completed and updated accomplishments of CDBG activities in IDIS. Continued monitoring of CDBG sub recipients and their programs.





- Continued to monitor calls, responsibilities, and procedures of the CDBG Code Enforcement Contractor for the City. Reviewed and monitored all record keeping being sure requirements are being followed to HUD Guidelines. Ensured Code compliance monitoring was being performed by the Contractor in the City Target Areas. Monitored to be sure the Standard Operating Procedures for CDBG Code Enforcement are being followed.
- During the month of May, I responded to a total of 23 Public Record requests for records from various City departments. The majority of these requests were for police incident/accident reports.
- Continued to modify or suspend certain operations during the month of May due to the ongoing Coronavirus/COVID-19 pandemic.

**Subject:** Income Tax Monthly Report – May 2021

**Date:** June 3, 2021

The total income tax receipts posted for May 2021 was \$2,014,115.20. This amount is an increase from May 2020 of \$1,100,376.20. (120%)

Year to date income tax receipts posted through 2021 was \$10,458,043.39. Receipts posted for 2021 was an increase from 2020 of \$2,403,668.75. (30%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represent 68% of all tax collections through the year of 2021. Individual income tax payments represent 17% of all tax collections through the year of 2021 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 15%.

Average monthly income for the five months of 2021 is \$2,091,608.68. Average monthly income for the year of 2020 was \$1,674,131.35. Average monthly income for the year of 2019 was \$1,758,409.86.

Year to date refunds for 2021 was \$280,026.41 compared to refunds for 2020 of \$192,441.90. Refunds difference \$87,584.51 (more refunds in 2021 compared to 2020).

Target budget from Auditor's Revenue Report is 41.67% for the following accounts for 2021. Account percentages collected for the five months of 2021 are as follows:

**Buckeye Ridge Estates** – Property has been sold to a new owner.

**Sippo Reserves Allotment Phase II** – Project has been transferred to a new developer, who will be completing any remaining items.

**Villa Sole Development**- Preliminary Plat submitted and approved by Planning Commission. Rezoning approved by council on February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Tree clearing complete. Plans approved and sent to EPA. Work began July 2020 on grading and underground utilities. Sanitary sewer, storm sewers, waterlines have been installed. Roadway installation in summer.

**Phoenix Avenue SE Project**-Plans submitted and approved by the City Engineer. Plat approved by Planning Commission. Construction summer 2019. Utility construction complete. Grading for roadway. Curb installed June 12<sup>th</sup>. Asphalt installed June 24<sup>th</sup>. Working on a few punch list items. Plat recorded on September 6<sup>th</sup>. Roadway is open and in use. Street lights installed.

**Westbrook Estates Phase V**- Plans submitted and approved by City Engineer, and Ohio EPA. Underground utility work has begun and is 100% complete. Final plat for Phase 5A approved by Planning Commission on April 10, 2019. Phase 5B and 5C approved by Planning Commission on June 12<sup>th</sup>. Curb and roadway have been installed. Housing construction complete. Street lighting installed.

The department responded to a total of 506 alarms during the month. This averages to 16.3 alarms per day. There were 152 fire alarms and/or public service calls, and 354 rescue and EMS calls. There were no injuries this month due to fires.

On the 31<sup>st</sup> of the month, I attended the Memorial Day events at Duncan Plaza. Firefighter/Medic Matt Seward accepted the firefighter's wreath.

A significant number of personnel have received their COVID-19 vaccination with additional staff waiting a specified time period determined by their personal physicians due to contracting COVID in recent months. The Fire Department did not have any member off due to COVID in the month of May. The first month since last September this has occurred. Even though our overall call volume is increasing, we are experiencing a significant drop in the number of COVID-19 related emergency responses due in no small part to the health orders in place and the increased vaccination efforts to a much broader population.

We started reducing protective measures in place, although we remain vigilant moving forward with the understanding COVID-19 is still a threat to all of us and could ramp up if we let our guard down too quickly. However, we have increased our training activity, fire safety inspections, and other department functions allowing us to meet residents and business owners' non-emergency needs to a level near pre COVID times.

Lastly, I would like to thank and applaud all city employees for their efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic. The actions of the command staff, support personnel, technical specialist, and all employees have minimized the impact on the city and its residents better than expected.

# TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

## MONTH OF MAY 2021

In May of 2021, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 175 traffic citations, 44 more than was issued during the same time period last year. Which resulted in a 210 total charges. The Massillon Police Department made 12 arrests for OVI, 5 more than were made in May of 2020. Radar citations for the month totaled; this was 25 more than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 74 traffic accidents during May. This was 7 more accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 34 property damage accidents, 13 injury accidents, there were 26 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents there were 12 hit skip accidents, and there were 2 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. The Massillon Police Department investigated 6 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 2 reported injuries. There was 1 motorcycle, 0 bicycle, 1 commercial, and 1 pedestrian accidents during the month. There were no fatal accidents in the city in the month of May.

In May of 2021 there were 68 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 2 less than the number towed in May of 2020. Of the above tows, 25 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 6 for traffic offenses of some type, 24 as a direct result of an arrest, 12 for parking violations. There was 0 recovered stolen vehicle and 1 misc. tows.

During the month of May 2021, the traffic officer mailed 26 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 18 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During May 2021 the traffic officer was able to junk or title 14 motor vehicles. Also during the month of May the traffic officer issued or acted upon 31 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 12 parking citations and investigated 0 school bus violation.

As of the last day of May 2021 there were 64 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of the two towing companies, Reed's and Patriot, with 4 in secured storage. Of the 64 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
