- 2. Progress of Strategic Planning
 - a) Terri states "As you know from last meeting we started with the board. We have completed 2 work groups now, the board and the staff. In June we will be conducting the public work groups with phone interviews and work groups. So we have 3 different ones for the public and several phone interviews. So we will be moving on with that."





New Business

- 1. Approval of Donations
 - a) Terri states "Those are in you packet. The rest of the donations we received really helped towards the fence. I don't have a total there, but it really cut down on what we had to pay for the fence. All these companies donated and it was just wonderful. We just need approval to accept the donation money."

Ann Palaski made a motion to accept the list of donations. Cathy Heitger seconds. Motion carried.

- 2. Current research on Public Health
 - a) Terri states "We have to, as far as for accreditation, present a Public Health- related topic each year to the Board. We found a really good one, it's exciting. It is about the harm reduction vending machine. It's right outside our front door. This is some research, and it's about the value of harm reduction machines. They're finding them more and more valued and how great they've been. There's a list on there with what we've given in just three months that have come from our machine. I myself have seen people walking up to it and it's just wonderful. Someone might need fentanyl test strips and they don't want to come in and ask for that, you know. Or even a Narcan kit. We have given 12 Naloxone (Narcan) kits. We like to look at that as 12 lives we may have saved. So you can just read that article on your own. On the very last page is how much we have given this year. Stark MHAR purchased the machines. Then Stark TASC fills the machine and they manage the inventory. So really all we do is if somebody comes in and asks they register for the machine, we help





them get registered. That's about it. Everybody else takes responsibility and then they tell us what we've used. Any questions?"

- b) Ann Palaski asks "To register to use the machine, do you need an email address?" Terri responds "You go online. It is right on the machine." Ann replies "I was just wondering how difficult it is for someone who's in a crisis. So it is something they need to do ahead of time. They've not going to be able to set that all up." Terri responds "No but a lot of counselors and workers have that, they give it out if they have a case or something.""
- c) Margaret Elum asks "What if they don't have a computer?" Terri responds "They could go to the library. They couldn't really do it 24/7. But if it's during the day they can come in here and we'll get them registered. Most of them have phones though. You can do it over the phone

3. Upcoming Outreach events

a) Terri states "We are joining the Obiemobile, if you've heard of that. That's the food giveaway for the summer food program. They do that every day but we meet them once a week throughout the summer with children's activities. What we're focusing on this year is bike safety, mental health, and healthy eating. So there is 3 different topics we have picked and we an informational table plus we have an activity. On the 14th at Reservoir Park we are going to be joined by Bear Hugs, who gives free clothing and we are going to give out bike helmets with bike safety. On the 24th we are going to be joined by Akron Children's Hospital, we're going to do an activity. We are going to have our interpreter there. That's at Walnut Hills. So hopefully we get some our Hispanic population. There's going to be a dance party that day. Then July 8th at Walnut Hills We will have our interpreter once again and Bear Hugs will give free clothing again. July 17th on the corner of Tremont & 8th they're going to do kids vision boards. So like what you dream of and what you do as your personality. For that they cut out pictures out of magazines and put them on a board. It's a lot of fun. We actually did that as activity here at the Health Department. It was pretty fun. July 22nd we'll be at Walnut Hills again.





Akron Children's will be there again, as well as also have our interpreter again. Then Reservoir Park on August 2nd. We are going to make fruit kabobs and that's going to focus activity on healthy eating. This year our big overall education is tick safety and we are taking demonstrations, like we have a kit on how to take a tick off. So that going to be an overall theme this year too. Does anybody have any questions?"

- b) Margaret Elum adds "Before we adjourn. Whoever is in charge of your website, they still have our positions as vacant. Then we are hallway through the year, there aren't any minutes listed. So if you could have them take care of that." Terri responds "OK,"
- c) Mayor Slutz asks if there is anything else that needs addressed. Ann responds "The surveys that we did, did you hear anything back from the strategic planner?" Terri responds "Yes. They start with the Board and end with the Board. We will do the public next then they'll come back around to the Board and you will get all the results. They do it like a circle."
