NOVEMBER MONTHLY REPORT

- Set up all Activities/Projects in IDIS for PY 2017 and also funded all projects.
- Attended Massillon Historic Preservation Commission meeting on 11/9/17. Commission voted on Board members for 2018, reviewed graphics for Healthalicious downtown business, discussed 20 South Erie Street business façade
- Work continued monitoring the calls, responsibilities, and procedures of the CDBG Code Enforcement Contractor
 for the City. Reviewed and monitored to ensure all record keeping requirements are being followed, according to
 HUD guidelines. Reviewed required forms completed by the Contractor; Daily Log Forms; Voucher Documents;
 Detailed Inspections by Date Reports. Ensuring that all records, paperwork, electronic entries are properly filled
 out and properly filed. Reviewed all reports filed, made sure CODE compliance monitoring is also being performed

SANITARY SEWERS

<u>State Avenue Sewer Rehab</u> – Began survey and preliminary design work on replacing a portion of the sanitary sewer. The design of Phase 1 and Phase 2 is 90% completed. Will be seeking funding sources to construct this project.

STORM SEWERS

<u>Burton Ave NW</u> – Evaluating flooding and resolutions.

16th Street SE Storm Sewer Repair - Review options for 2018 project.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

<u>WWTP Upgrade Project</u> – Current project scope is to upgrade the existing WWTP average daily flow from 15.8 MGD to 17.0 MGD; modify existing aeration tanks, primary and secondary clarifiers, and sludge pumping to enable biological nutrient removal; replace and upgrade tertiary filter capacity; modify sludge conditioning and digestion facilities; modify and upgrade electrical and instrumentation systems. Construction began in March of 2016.

STREETS

<u>Wales Road (SR 241) Improvement Project</u> – Funding has been secured through SCATS for FY 2020. Project will improve the existing roadway and infrastructure from Lincoln Way (SR172) and Hills & Dales. Developing schedule. Scope and costs.

<u>Springhill Settlement Reconstruction</u> – Developing estimate and survey. Exploring funding options, evaluating drainage, under drains for Spring 2018.

Richville Dr. Widening - Plans and estimates. Awarded by OPWC expected July 2018.

The total income tax receipts posted for November 2017was \$1,281,069.29. This amount is an increase from November 2016 of \$213,994.81 (+20%).

Year to date income tax receipts posted through the eleventh month 2017 was \$18,905,299.11. Receipts posted year to date through the eleventh month was an increase from 2016 of \$1,162,269.30 (+7%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 70% of all tax collections through the eleven months of 2017. Individual income tax payments represents 14% of all tax collections through the eleven months of 2017 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 16%.

Average monthly income for the eleven months of 2017 is \$1,718,663.55.

Year to date refunds through the eleven months of 2017 was \$-436,697.53 compared to refunds through the eleven months of 2016 of \$-366,991.61. Refunds difference \$69,705.92 (more in refunds 2017 compared to 2016).







TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In November of 2017 the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 157 traffic citations, 54 less traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 15 arrests for OVI, 3 less than in November of 2016. Radar Citations for the month totaled 15 which was 15 less than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 98 traffic accidents during November. This was 7 more than last year at this time. There were 49 property damage accidents, 18 injury accidents, 31 accidents that occurred on private property, of the above accidents there were 20 hit skip accidents, there were 5 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs during the month. There were 2 pedestrian accidents and no bicycle or motorcycle accidents during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 10 accidents involving juveniles that resulted in 3 injuries. There was 1 fatal accident.

In November 2017 there were 66 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 5 less than were towed in November of 2016. Of the above tows, 28 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 5 for traffic offenses of some type, 19 as a direct result of an arrest and 11 for parking violations. There were no stolen/recovered vehicles and 3 misc. tows. The traffic officer issued 16 parking citations and did not investigate any school bus violations during the month.

During the month of November 2017 the traffic officer was able to mail 22 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer submitted 14 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During November the traffic officer was able to junk or title 15 motor vehicles. Also during the month of November the traffic officer issued or acted upon 29 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners.

As of the last day of November 2017 there were 45 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Reed's Incorporated and Patriot Towing Service. Of the 45 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
