Monthly Report – October 2017

### **OCTOBER MONTHLY REPORT**

- Completed and submitted the Section 3/Form 60002 to HUD, via the SPEARS system, on October 2, 2017.
- On October 3, 2017 Completed and Submitted the Certified Local Government Performance Evaluation to Nathan Bevil, Ohio History Connection. On October 10, 2017 we received a follow up letter from Nathan Bevil in regards to our CLG Evaluation – there were no deficiencies found in the review and the evaluation is complete.
- Completed and submitted the SF 425 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter report to HUD, on October 10, 2017.
- Completed and submitted the HUD MBE 2516, semi-annual report, on October 4, 2017, due by October 15, 2017
- Attended the Massillon Historic Preservation Commission on Thursday, October 19, 2017.
- Attended the City Council Work Session on October 9, 2017 and regular Council Meeting on October 16.
   Presented legislation for the appropriations of the 2017 HUD Budget and also legislation for Safety Service Director to enter into Funding Agreements with our Sub-recipients.
- Attended Council Work Session on 10/30/17 to present Legislation for HOME appropriation.
- After initial review of the 2016 CAPER, on October 13 our HUD Rep requested additional information for clarification purposes. All information was submitted for review on October 20, 2017. On October 23, 2017, received letter from HUD in regards to their preliminary review of the 2016 CAPER. The End of Year Assessment results and related conclusions to be received 60 days after CAPER was submitted, approximately November 30, 2017.
- On October 25 &26, 2017 attended the Fall OCCD Conference in Columbus. Topics presented were Using Historic Preservation as a Development Tool, Federal & State Legislation Updates, Mapping and Using Social Media to Promote what we do.
- The Community Development Department and CDBG Code Enforcement are continuing their efforts to reduce slum and blight. Work continued monitoring the calls, responsibilities, and procedures of the CDBG Code Enforcement Contractor for the City. Reviewed and monitored to ensure all record keeping requirements are being followed, according to HUD guidelines. I reviewed the required forms completed by the Contractor; Daily Log Forms; Voucher Documents; Detailed Inspections by Date Reports. Ensuring that all records, paperwork, electronic entries are properly filled out and properly filed. Reviewed all reports filed, made sure CODE compliance monitoring is also being performed by the Contractor in the City target areas. Monitored to be sure the "Standard Operating Procedures" (SOP) for CDBG code enforcement are being followed.
- Met with all the Sub-Recipients that were awarded CDBG Grant Funding for the Program Year 2017/2018.
   Reviewed the Funding Agreements with each organization's representative. Once returned will forward to the City Auditor, Safety Service Director and Law Director to fully execute the agreements.
- Access to our 2017 Program Year CDBG funds are now available. The department is working on setting up all
  projects for 2017, while continuing to close out all projects for 2016 Program Year.
- Attended City Council Work Session on October 30, 2017 to present legislation on Historic Preservation
   Commission ordinance amendment & requesting additional funds to be appropriated for HOME 1229 account.

17th Street NE Bridge —Funding for this project has been approved from ODOT's Ohio Bridge Partnership. This is a design/build project that will be administered by ODOT. Began 9/11/17. 100% complete. Culvert complete. Paving finished in October.

### **SANITARY SEWERS**

<u>State Avenue Sewer Rehab</u> – Began survey and preliminary design work on replacing a portion of the sanitary sewer. The design of Phase 1 and Phase 2 is 90% completed. Will be seeking funding sources to construct this project.

Burton Ave NW – Evaluating flooding and resolutions.

16th Street SE Storm Sewer Repair - Review options for 2018 project.

### WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

<u>WWTP Upgrade Project</u> – Current project scope is to upgrade the existing WWTP average daily flow from 15.8 MGD to 17.0 MGD; modify existing aeration tanks, primary and secondary clarifiers, and sludge pumping to enable biological nutrient removal; replace and upgrade tertiary filter capacity; modify sludge conditioning and digestion facilities; modify and upgrade electrical and instrumentation systems. The total income tax receipts posted for October 2017was \$1,505,647.20. This amount is a decrease from October 2016 of \$-10,089.26.

Year to date income tax receipts posted through the tenth month 2017 was \$17,624,229.82. Receipts posted year to date through the tenth month was an increase from 2016 of \$948,274.49 (+6%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 69% of all tax collections through the ten months of 2017. Individual income tax payments represents 15% of all tax collections through the ten months of 2017 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 16%.

Average monthly income for the ten months of 2017 is \$1,762,422.98.

Year to date refunds through the ten months of 2017 was \$-341,944.32 compared to refunds through the ten months of 2016 of \$-343,586.28. Refunds difference \$-1,641.96 (less in refunds 2017 compared to 2016).

### TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In October of 2017 the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 152 traffic citations, 74 less than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 16 arrests for OVI, this was 3 more than last year. Radar citations for the month totaled 8, this was 16 less than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 81 traffic accidents during October. This was 11 less than last year at this time. There were 48 property damage accidents, 8 injury accidents, 1 fatal accident and 25 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents, there were 13 hit skip accidents. There were 5 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There were no motorcycle or bicycle accidents and 1 pedestrian accident during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 9 accidents involving juveniles that resulted in 1 injury.

In October 2017 there were 73 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 10 less than were towed in October 2016. Of the above tows, 30 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 21 as a direct result of an arrest, 15 for parking violations and 7 for traffic offenses of some type. There were no miscellaneous tows or recovered stolen vehicles during the month.

During the month of October 2017, the traffic officer mailed 24 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 14 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During October 2017, the traffic officer was able to junk or title 11 motor vehicles. Also during the month of October the traffic officer issued or acted upon 32 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices). The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged, and filed, several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners. The traffic officer issued 17 parking citations and investigated 10 school bus violations..

As of the last day of October 2017, there were 39 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Reed's Incorporated and Patriot Towing Service. Of the 39 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them.
