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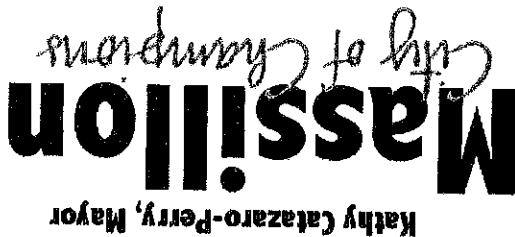

- Submitted the PR-29 Financial Accounting Report to HUD for calendar year 2021 Quarter 3, which covers July 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021.

- Planning and coordinating filming of Community Showcase Video Program with CGI.
- Continued working with the Administration on spending plan for the ARPA funding.
- Continued working with Code Enforcement on the City's 2021 Demolition Program. Awarded bids and contracts. Demolition work was completed on 5 properties. A TAAAP application is currently pending with the SCLRC for one additional property, located at 1333 14th St. SE. There is enough funding remaining for one to two additional demolitions depending on costs.

- Continued accounting and financial management for CDBG expenditures. Reported and made entries in IDIS for accounting management. Completed and updated accomplishments of CDBG activities in IDIS. Continued monitoring of CDBG sub recipients and their programs.
- Continued to monitor calls, responsibilities, and procedures of the CDBG Code Enforcement Contractor for the City. Reviewed and monitored all record keeping being sure requirements are being followed to HUD Guidelines. Ensured Code compliance monitoring was being performed by the Contractor in the City Target Areas.

- During the month of October, I responded to a total of 13 Public Record requests for records from various City departments. The majority of these requests were for police incident and/or accident reports.

- **Fair Housing Calls for the Month: Beverly 21 Anna 15**

Code Enforcement Involvement – Yes, as needed

Housing Rehabilitation Projects: We are fully underway with a Full Rehabilitation for a homeowner.

- **Minor Repair:** The award has been given to one of our Contractors for the lift and ramp. The work is ready for inspection.
- Home owner who was well over the allowance to receive a Full Rehab, has been moved to Minor Repair. Hopefully we will provide a couple of things that are necessities for her home.
- We have received the request for a home owners windows and electric work to be done. We have a Contractor and have had the pre-construction meeting. Work began in September, however there may be a delay in getting the windows due to the shortage.
- Work is complete for the porch for one of our homeowners. Inspection and payment will be next.

Emergency Rehabilitation Projects:

- Roof started in the end of October scheduled to be completed.
- We are signing the contract and other documentation to put a furnace in for a homeowner before the cold weather begins.
- We have another furnace in the works, we are waiting on a bids from contractors.

First time Homebuyer Assisted:

- We have provided another first-time homebuyer with down payment assistance, we will be sending her the Intent to Proceed with her RRS items.
- We have also closed on two more first time homebuyers and sent them the Intent to Proceed so that we can do their RRS items.
- We have one homebuyer near closing, we are waiting own the CD from her lending institution.
- One perspective homebuyer was over-income so could not continue in our program.
- Another perspective homebuyer could not fine a home to purchase at this time.

- **MEETINGS ATTENDED DURING THE MONTH WERE:** October 6, 2021 – Pre-Construction for Full Rehabilitation. October 12, 2021, COC Board Meeting, October 26, 2021 COC Bd Meeting Awards; October 19, Pre-Construction meeting; October 27, 2021, First time homebuyer closing.

- **WEBINARS: Scheduled** - October 6, 2021 Program Administration and Non-Profit Operating Expenses, 2-3; October 13, 2021 2-3:30 Best Practices Economic Development and Assist to Business; October 14, 2021 2-3:30 Public Services; October 26, 2021 2-3:30, Public Facilities & Building Improvements; October 27, 2021 2:3:30 Interim affordable Housing.
- **OTHER ACTIVITIES: FAIR HOUSING** – We had several fair housing calls during the month. Many of which dealt with possible evictions and repairs. There are many tenant/landlord issues. I am concerned about a tenant who was without proper water service for quite some time. Her landlord had to have repair work done at the street level. Worked with a moderator to charge the disabled tenant an additional rent fee to pay for his having to do the repair to his own property. This has caused a hardship because her rent went up \$120.

- **Housing:** Full Rehab project is about half completed already. Homebuyers: Another new buyer purchased in Massillon and closed in October using the Down Payment Assistance Program. We have another buyer scheduled to close in the next couple of weeks. One home buyer is in process of getting RRS items repaired, and we have bids due soon for two more of these new home owners.
- **Fair Housing:** For the month of October I received 15 fair housing calls. Calls included both landlord, tenant, and repair issues. We have worked closely with code enforcement on many negligent landlord calls this month. We have answered calls on tenant rights, as well as foreclosure questions. Rights of a disabled tenant, and questions about service animals.
- **Community Development:** We continue to utilize CDBG funding for our Emergency and Minor repair programs. A repair project was completed for a home owner with unsafe porch conditions. A family has updated plumbing and electric completed through the Minor Repair Program. Replacement windows were installed for a Massillon Home owner. Resident is able to open her windows for the first time in over a decade. We have two furnaces scheduled to be installed soon for Massillon home owners as well.
- **Administrative:** Prepared and paid bills/ IDIS drawdowns for funds. Updated and opened new activities in IDIS as necessary. Ledger balanced and maintained accurately throughout the month. Updated housing project ledger, and financial ledger. Varied tasks as assigned. Supplies ordered as needed.

Subject: Income Tax Monthly Report – October 2021

Date: November 5, 2021

The total income tax receipts posted for October 2021 was \$1,548,600.08. This amount is an increase from October 2020 of \$24,265.58. (+2%)

Year to date income tax receipts posted through 2021 was \$19,008,192.41. Receipts posted for 2021 was an increase from 2020 of \$1,928,412.93. (+11%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represent 71% of all tax collections through the year of 2021. Individual income tax payments represent 13% of all tax collections through the year of 2021 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 16%.

TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In October of 2021, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 147 traffic citations, 31 less traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 8 arrests for OVI, 4 fewer than were made in October of 2020. Radar Citations for the month totaled 14, this was 15 less than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 72 traffic accidents during October. That was 2 more accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 49 property damage accidents, 8 injury accidents, there were 15 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents there were 8 hit skip accidents, and there were 1 accident that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There was 0 bicycle and 1 pedestrian accidents during the month. There was 1 motorcycle, 2 commercial accidents during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 3 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 1 reported injury. There was 0 fatal accidents.

In October of 2021 there were 67 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 22 less than were towed in October 2020. Of the above tows, 31 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 17 for traffic offenses of some type, 9 as a direct result of an arrest, and 9 for parking violations. There was 1 stolen/recovered vehicles and 0 miscellaneous tow.

During the month of October 2021 the traffic officer mailed 33 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 25 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During October 2021 the traffic officer was able to junk or title 29 motor vehicles. Also during the month of October, the traffic officer issued or acted upon 12 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices) issued 9 parking citations and investigated 2 school bus violations. The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners and conducted 0 garbage truck inspections.

As of the last day of October 2021 there were 49 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Reed's and Patriot Towing Services. Of the 49 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them and 3 are being held in secured storage.
