- September 26th Health Improvement and Equity Committee Meeting at Massillon Health Department
- Continued to work on the Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Report (CAPER) for the 2018 Program Year. A public hearing was held on September 9th in City Council Chambers to review accomplishments and answer any questions from the public. A draft of the CAPER was also available for public review and inspection from September 5th through September 20th. The report was posted on the City of Massillon website, and copies were available at both the Massillon Public Library and the lobby area in the City Administration building. No comments were submitted.
- Submitted the Section 3 Report to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on September 11th, 2019. This report is an annual requirement from HUD and is used for reporting annual accomplishments regarding employment, training, contracting, and other economic opportunities provided to low- and very low-income persons, and the businesses that employ them.
- Completed all Neighborhood Initiative Program activities, including demolitions and submitting reimbursement packets to the Stark County Land Reutilization Corporation for all of the remaining Massillon properties. Once reimbursement is received from SCLRC/OHFA the NIP program will have concluded.



- Coordinated with the Massillon Auditor's office to close out the Section 108 Loan account with Bank of New York Mellon. The final loan payment was submitted in August of 2019.
- Began preparations for the 2019 Job Fair. The Job Fair will be held at the Massillon Recreation Center on October 23rd, 2019. The City of Massillon is once again partnering with Ohio Means Jobs to host this year's fair.
- Continued to monitor calls, responsibilities, and procedures of the CDBG Code Enforcement Contractor for the City. Reviewed and monitored all record keeping being sure requirements are being followed to HUD Guidelines. Ensured Code compliance monitoring was being performed by the Contractor in the City Target Areas. Monitored to be sure the Standard Operating Procedures for CDBG Code Enforcement are being followed.

The total income tax receipts posted for September 2019 was \$1,829,532.25. This amount is a decrease from September 2018 of \$-17,629.12 (-1%).

Year to date income tax receipts posted through the nine months of 2019 was \$16,112,113.10. Receipts posted for 2019 was a decrease from 2018 of \$-156,744.53 (-1%).

Payroll tax withheld by Massillon employers represents 72% of all tax collections through the year of 2019. Individual income tax payments represent 12% of all tax collections through the year of 2019 and Net Profit income tax payments represent 16%.

Average monthly income for the nine months of 2019 is \$1,790,234.79. Average monthly income for the year of 2018 was \$1,740,903.69. Average monthly income for the year of 2017 was \$1,734,942.16.

Year to date refunds for 2019 was \$218,178.26 compared to refunds for 2018 of \$461,157.08. Refunds difference \$242,978.82 (more in refunds 2018 compared to 2019).

Target budget from Auditor's Revenue Report is 75.00% for the following accounts for 2019. Account percentages collected for the nine months of 2019 are as follows:

TRAFFIC ACTIVITY REPORT

In September of 2019, the Massillon Police Department issued a total of 107 traffic citations, 115 fewer traffic citations than were issued during the same time period last year. The Massillon Police Department made 10 arrests for OVI, 7 less than was made in September of 2018. Radar Citations for the month totaled 15, this was 21 fewer than last year during the same time period.

The Massillon Police Department handled a total of 65 traffic accidents during September. That was 16 fewer accidents than occurred last year during the same time period. There were 37 property damage accidents, 7 injury accidents, there were 21 accidents that occurred on private property. Of the above accidents there were 6 hit skip accidents, and there were 2 accidents that occurred as a direct result of alcohol and/or drugs. There was 1 bicycle and no pedestrian accidents during the month. There were no motorcycle accident during the month. The Massillon Police Department investigated 8 accidents involving juveniles resulting in 1 reported injury. There were no fatal accidents.

In September of 2019 there were 70 motor vehicles towed by the Massillon Police Department. This was 16 fewer than were towed in September 2018. Of the above tows, 32 vehicles were towed from traffic accidents, 11 for traffic offenses of some type, 19 as a direct result of an arrest, and 7 for parking violations. There were no stolen/recovered vehicles and 1 miscellaneous tow.

During the month of September 2019 the traffic officer mailed 23 certified letters in regards to junk and/or abandoned motor vehicles. The traffic officer made 10 title searches to the State of Ohio, Bureau of Motor Vehicles. During September 2019 the traffic officer was able to junk or title 19 motor vehicles. Also during the month of September, the traffic officer issued or acted upon 30 notices (48/72 hour and/or 10/20 day notices) issued 6 parking citations and investigated 0 school bus violations. The traffic officer further sent numerous 2255's and driver's licenses to the state. The traffic officer logged and filed several license plates, and kept track of the motor vehicles awaiting court order for immobilization, confiscation or return to the owners and conducted 0 garbage truck inspections.

As of the last day of September 2019 there were 41 motor vehicles sitting upon the impound lots of Reed's and Patriot Towing Services. Of the 41 vehicles, several are waiting for court order to dispose of them and 3 are being held in secured storage.

Following is a breakdown of the individual tows, accidents, citations and OVI arrest for the month of September 2019.
